Welcome to South East Junior High! South East opened in 1960 and received structural upgrades in 1981, 1995, 2006, and 2009. Our students attend City High School after leaving South East. Here in Little Hawk territory, we offer a rich comprehensive educational program in an eight period day format. The standard core classes are offered along with electives including but not limited to world language, orchestra, writer's guild, and leadership. 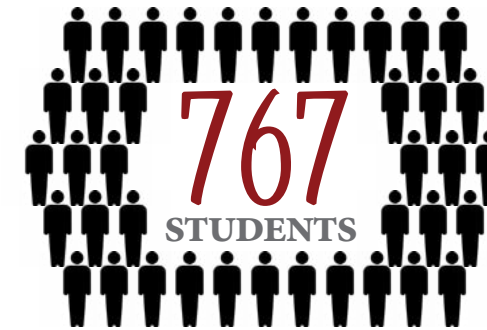

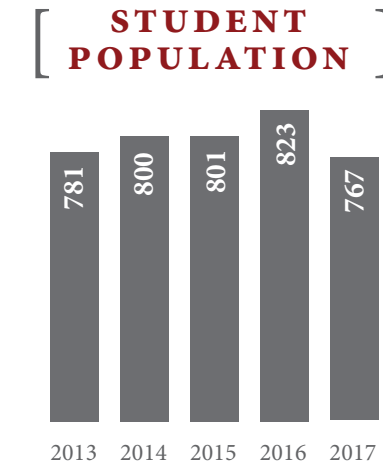

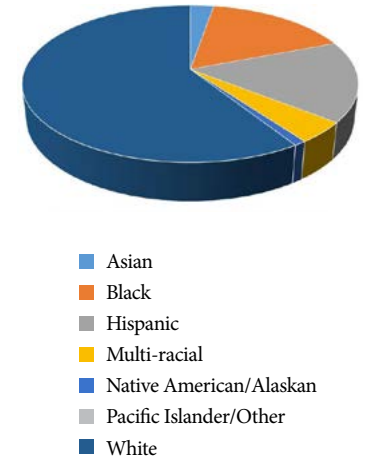

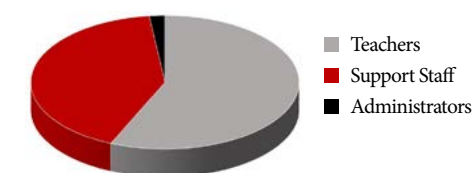

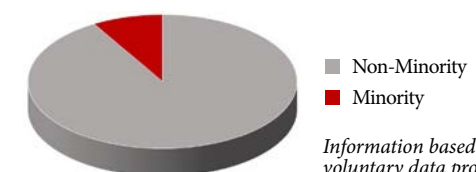

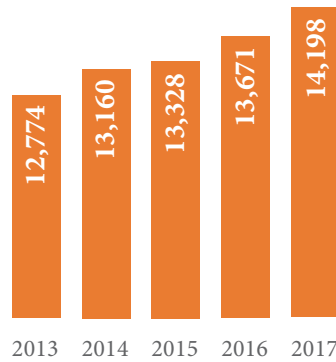

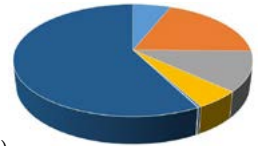

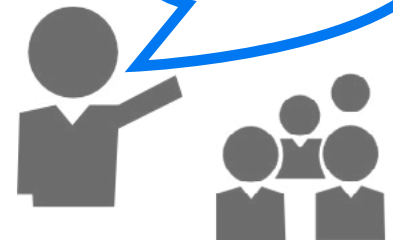

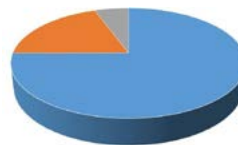
CLASSROOM-FOCUSED PRIORITIES

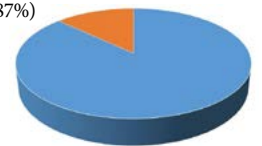

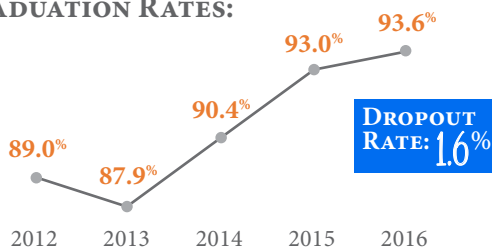
