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Important Notes:

1. Textbook and planner fees collected go into the General Operating Fund of the District to support the instructional program District wide. Building budget allocations will be set up to provide an established level of resources to each building based on a per pupil basis for the projected enrollment of that building. This is an equitable way of funding and eliminates the free and reduced student factor between buildings based on fee waivers. It should be noted that the "planner" fee is elementary grades 3-6 only and replaces the need to charge for journals which we can no longer do.
2. ICCSD does not have any type of formal refund policy for fees however the following are guidelines you should follow:

Early Graduates or individual who let us know at registration that they will be moving/transferring/finishing during the school year:

- A.. Prorate by full Trimester for textbook fees only.
- B. If a student is leaving mid-trimester, we would charge textbook fees for that incomplete trimester as well.
- C. Full amount will be charged on individual class fees and optional fees, no proration.

Charges per Trimester:

- High School Trimester fee- \$30.00
- Jr. High Trimester fee- \$23.00
- Elementary Trimester fee- \$11.50

Example: Jr. High student is moving out of the district on January 1st, 2019. We would charge \$46.00 for textbook fees and the full amount of any other fees.

Dual Enrolled/Home schooled Students

If the student is with us less than 50% of the day, the reduction will match that of the reduced lunch. We will reduce the textbook fee by 40%. The parent/guardian will pay 60%. Full amount will be charged on individual class fees and optional fees, no reduction.

Reduction Amounts

- High School- Full amount \$90.00 is reduced to \$54.00
- Jr. High- Full amount \$70.00 is reduced to \$42.00
- Elementary- Full amount \$35.00 is reduced to \$21.00

Example: High School student is home schooled, but taking 3 classes with us. We would charge \$54.00 for textbook fees and the full amount for each class and any optional fees.

3. Upon proper verification reduced price students should be given a fee reduction equal to 40% for both elementary and secondary. (Example: An Elementary Student on reduced price meal status would pay \$21.00. *Computation* $\$35.00 \times .60 = \21.00 (which is a 40% reduction) Using a similar computation a reduced status JR High Student would pay \$42.00 and a High School Student would pay \$54.00. This reduction only applies to the mandatory fees and only when the parent has completed the proper fee waiver form. Any optional fees such as athletic passes or yearbooks, etc. are not subject to this reduction. Free students are not required to pay the mandatory fees.

4. It is not permissible to charge a fee for field trips, recorder (music) units, homework folders, protractors, special math devices for Every Day Math, harmonicas, assignment notebooks, or journals, etc. and must be paid from your building budget. Now, a strong case could be made that items such as assignment notebooks and journals would fit into the category of student planner and you can charge the student for these items. Any "enhanced" item a student gets above the standard for the class you can charge for the difference in cost.

5. It is permissible to charge a fee to any student for lost, stolen, or damaged books, replacement ID cards, replacement bus passes, and optional math books for parents to use over the summer, etc. The fees for these items should can be rounded up for simplicity in accounting but the value should closely reflect the cost of the item to the
