Students choose to attend schools outside their attendance area for many different reasons. For example, schools who qualify for federal Title I funding and who have not met pre-determined achievement targets set by the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) legislation must provide transfers to students requesting them. (The schools with an asterisk in the 2012-13 chart are Title I schools who are required to provide transfers out if requested.) It is important to note that several district schools, in addition to the six schools receiving Title I funds, have not met the pre-determined achievement targets set by the NCLB legislation, which directs that ALL children must be achieving at or above grade level by 2014.

There were 172 new transfer requests granted in 2012-13. Slightly more than half of them (87 of the 172) were requested and granted to families whose children were currently attending a school, who moved to another attendance zone, and who desired to have their student remain in his/her current school.
