

High School Program Overview

The Extended Learning Program at the high school level is not a class. Instead, it involves a series of targeted, deliberate and proactive services within the Guidance Office that will be conducted during the school day by an Extended Learning Program Counselor. It is designed to supplement general education counseling for students with academic performance and needs beyond regular counseling and education services. An emphasis is placed on the specific timeline of academic needs students have throughout their four years in high school. A continuum of services is provided to students, as outlined in the diagram below. A new cohort of students is selected yearly in early Spring based on Iowa Assessments scores and cumulative Grade Point Averages. For students who do not enter the screening pool based on standardized test scores and/or GPA, there is an application process. Please contact your school's ELP Counselor for further information.
